Dear Parents and Carers,

Assalaam-Alaikum/Peace be with you.

School has now been re-open for nearly three weeks and we are pleased with the way the students have settled back into school and they have used their time well to re-establish routines. As we are approaching the end of term I would like to thank you for your continued support during these challenging times. **School will be closed from Monday 29th March and will re-open on Monday 12th April insha'Allah.**

### **Reporting of Positive Covid Tests over the holidays**

If you need to report a positive covid test from Saturday 27th March to 1st April 2021 **please inform school by contacting reception.** You will need to be able to provide the following information: Name of Daughter, Form Group, date of when symptoms began (or date of positive test), and the last date of attendance in school. Please also provide a phone number on which you can be contacted for further information if need be. This will enable us to fulfil our Track and Trace responsibilities.

### **COVID-19 - Testing Students at Home**

If your daughter has been issued with a home testing kit please can you ensure that your daughter completes two tests a week at 3-5 day intervals. It is important that a test is carried out on Sunday 11th April prior to the students returning to school after the break. Further kits will be distributed after Easter when we are expecting an update about the testing.

### **Reminder: What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19**

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the date when their symptoms appeared. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119. All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'. Further information is available at: <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection>. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

**If you are unsure of whether your daughter should attend school or not, please contact the school for further advice. Please do not send your daughter into school if she or anyone she has been in close contact with has symptoms or has tested positive.** If your child does develop symptoms, you can seek advice from the nhs.uk website at <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms/>. If you are concerned about your child's symptoms, or they are worsening you can seek advice from NHS 111 at <https://111.nhs.uk/> or by phoning 111.
