<b>KS3 Intervention</b>	£16,481	Feversham identifies pupils at risk who may have poor learning outcomes and who need additional monitoring. The intervention post provides evidence-based intervention that has the flexibility to be adjusted in the intensity and nature depending on the pupils' responsiveness. KS3 Pupil Premium development areas such as Literacy include: promoting pupils' progress in speaking and listening, reading and writing, being clear, coherent and accurate in spoken and written communication, reading and understanding a range of texts, and responding appropriately, demonstrating a secure understanding of the conventions of written language, including grammar, spelling and punctuation.
<b>KS4 Intervention</b>	£16,494	Based on the educational needs of the pupil, intervention is targeted to ensure specific objectives, activities, timeframes and evaluation is in place. KS4 learning becomes focused on coursework, exam preparation and their choices after leaving school. Feversham Academy considers the support of our KS4 pupils essential towards helping them achieve to the best of their abilities, both in terms of academic success and personal growth.

<b>Attendance Officer Post</b>	£13,130	Attendance Officer Post in place to focus on attendance of vulnerable pupils. Attendance data supports the significant impact of this school resource and the necessity for this role to continue.
<b>Literacy and Oracy Development</b>		
<b>Reading Matters</b>	£1,100	Reading Matters is a 1:1 intervention to improve reading for meaning. Students with reading ages at least 3 years below their chronological age receive 10 weeks intervention, during which time their reading ages improve by an average of 18 months. Attitude to reading, confidence and self-esteem also improve.
<b>First Story</b>	£2,750	First Story is a national literacy charity which has arranged for an acclaimed writer to work with a group of students in a series of 90-minute weekly workshops which inspire mature and sophisticated forms of writing leading to raised academic achievement. <b>Reading Co- Ordinator Post</b>	£20,000	0.4fte Upper 3 post dedicated to the Literacy and Oracy Development implementation programme, data analysis and long term good practice school wide
